ARTS

Drawing and Painting the Portrait N. Steele

Students draw and paint the portrait from photo references and live models (provide your own live model for this course). This course emphasizes the importance of the anatomy of the figure to the building of a portrait, the properties of colour application as it applies to the portrait, the structural lines and shapes that create the illusion of the portrait form in space and a four stage alla prima process in painting the portrait. Students are encouraged to work in oils, but acrylics can be used.

Let it Flow K. Richter

The diversity of watercolour makes it the perfect medium for quick sketches, vignettes or serious studio painting. This course will cover all the aspects of painting in this medium, from reference photography to different painting techniques, composition and design to colour choices and theory. Karin welcomes all levels of painters eager to explore, improve, and perfect their craft. Through demonstrations, talks, and constructive critiques, Karin will help participants reach their creative potential.

No Brushes Allowed F. Radford

This course focuses on methods of painting used by artists in the latter half of the 20th Century/early 21st Century. Using unconventional tools like spatulas, rulers, sticks, scrapers, old cards, you will learn how to create a painting without having to touch a traditional brush! This is an acrylics based course. Be prepared to possibly get out of your comfort zone, and have fun!

Watercolour – How to use transparent colours M. Kim-Hunter

Keeping transparency is very important in watercolour. Learn to mix colours and avoid muddiness. Explore warm and cool colours, colour mixing, greens and grays, and colour balance in painting. Develop your own colour palette. All levels welcome.

Writing Genre Fiction G. Strathy

Learn the secrets of writing stories in popular fiction genres such as: Crime/Mystery, Romance, Fantasy, Science Fiction, Horror, Adventure, Thriller, Suspense, or Western. Using examples, you will discover the classic structure and traits of major genres (chosen by the class) as a jumping off point for your own work. You'll have opportunities to develop ideas, write flash fiction/short stories, and create outlines for full-length works.





BUSINESS

Marketing 1

Marketing 1 is the first course of a two-course Introduction to Marketing designed to provide students with a sound grounding in the field of marketing. Emphasis is placed on the formulation of integrated marketing strategies that play a role in achieving organizational objectives. The course is divided into four segments: marketing process and marketing environments; marketing planning and information collection processes; buyer behaviour and targeting strategies; and marketing mix (two components of the mix are discussed: product and price).

Social Media Marketing

Social media now plays an important role in any company's marketing strategy. In this course you will be provided with a fundamental understanding of many of the different social media channels including the use of mobile apps and games for social media marketing. Once an understanding of the social media channels is established you will learn how to leverage the channels to engage audiences, and integrate with traditional media, in order to achieve marketing objectives.

FINANCIAL PLANNING

Essential Financial Planning S. Murphy

If you could only take one personal finance course in your life, this should be the one. Gain the knowledge, skills, and confidence required to enhance your financial well-being. Topics include Expense & Debt Management, Investment Planning, Education Savings Planning, Insurance Planning, Retirement Planning, Elder Care Planning, and Estate Planning.

Estate Planning for Executors S. Murphy

It is estimated that up to 70% of Canadian do not have a current and valid Will and that over 90% of Canadians appoint a family member as their executor. In recent years, the role of the executor has changed and along with these changes has come an increased risk of personal liability to the role. Growing areas of focus for both testators and executors are considerations for how to take into account topics such as extended family members, second marriages, and blended family structures. Information sessions such as this will provide executors with the information they need to better facilitate a successful estate settlement.

Retirement Planning

With the increase in life expectancy for both men and women, retirement planning has become increasingly important in preparing individuals' overall financial plans. The Retirement Planning course will provide learners with the basic tools and skills needed to prepare retirement plans for their prospective clients. Learners will review various sources of income at retirement including; Government Sponsored Retirement Income Programs, Employer Sponsored Pension Plans, Deferred Profit Sharing Plans, and Personal Savings Plans and incorporate these into retirement savings plans and post-retirement income plans. This unit also incorporates Education Planning, Home Buyers' Plan, and Tax-Free Savings, as they relate to retirement and savings.

GENERAL EDUCATION

General Education courses expose students to disciplines outside of their main field of study. Through General Education, students become more conscious of the diversity, complexity, and richness of the human experience, and as a result, are better able to contribute thoughtfully, creatively, and positively to their communities.

Disclaimer: Students wishing to register for a General Education course as part of their full-time certificate or diploma must receive formal approval from their Program Coordinator before registration. Some General Education courses are too close to the vocational specializations of specific programs and are therefore excluded as an option for students.

World of Astronomy

Astronomy is the study of all which is beyond the Earth. This course examines the visible features of the sky: the Moon, the Sun, planets, stars, constellations, meteors and galaxies. Students learn how to “navigate across the night sky” by moving from constellation to constellation in a logical and progressive manner. In addition, students examine the content of key constellations in detail and develop skills in analyzing and explaining unique astronomical phenomena.

HEALTH & WELLNESS

Introduction to Psychological Safety D. Lefebvre

Now is the time to invest in psychological safety. While mental health problems and illnesses are the leading cause of short and long-term disability in Canada, mental health experts and thought leaders are citing mental health as a second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. This introductory course will give leaders, supervisors, managers, and HR professionals insight to psychological safety and its impact on individual health, innovation, team interactions, and productivity, with an introduction to the National Standard for Psychological Health and Safety in the Workplace. Senior and middle management, committee leaders, Health & Safety personnel, and human resource departments will benefit from this course. It is relevant to any industry or setting.

Responding to Trauma: The Trauma-Informed Framework D. Lefebvre

Trauma is prevalent in our world and has an impact on many of the people we interact with, including clients and colleagues. A compassionate and trauma-informed approach is essential to providing effective support and building sustainable programs and services. The key objective of this course is to provide information about identifying and responding to trauma with evidence-based resilience strategies. The course introduces a capacity-building framework for building resilience, and how to implement evidence-based strategies into action to build a trauma-informed culture in any setting. Participants will develop an understanding of the pervasive impact of trauma on individual health and relationships. This course will be of benefit to those working with vulnerable populations in health and social services, both acute and community care, as well as educators and support staff.

HEALTH CARE

Dementia Studies: Overview of Dementia Care A. Evans

In an aging society, an understanding of dementia is becoming increasingly critical for families and caregivers. In this course, normal aging versus dementia is discussed including symptoms, reasons for behaviours, and best practice care principles. Topics include brain and brain changes and their effects on communication and care strategies, as well as legal and ethical implications. This course is the prerequisite for all other Dementia Studies Statement of Achievement courses.



Subsequent topics of study include an examination of natural disasters, minerals, rocks, fossils, and the relationships between environmental concerns and Geology. Students will also have the opportunity to explore Oceanography,

Meteorology and Astronomy. Because Geology is such a visual science, every attempt shall be made to provide the student with good visuals so that, when out in the field, they will recognize certain land features and be able to identify certain rocks, minerals and fossils.
